Recipe for Fruit Cake

4 oz Margarine	1 level teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
6 oz. granulated sugar	1 heaped teaspoon of mixed spice
6 oz. currants	2 beaten eggs
6 oz. sultanas	4 oz. plain flour
2 oz. chopped peel	4 oz. self-raising flour
1 cup (8 liquid oz.) water	pinch of salt

Place margarine, sugar, currants, sultanas, peel, water, bicarbonate of soda and mixed spice in a pan, bring to boil and simmer 1 minute. Pour into a large mixing bowl. Allow to cool.

Line a 7 inch square (or 8 inch round) tin with greased, grease-proof paper.

Add eggs, flours and salt to cooled mixture, mix well and pour into tin.

Bake in centre oven at 180 deg C, 350 deg F (Gas 4) for 1¼ hours.
